It's nothing short of criminal to increase rates by 300% just for the few days of the show.

I had always wanted to stay at the iconic Royal York Hotel, but the rates were ridiculous, so two years ago as I was arriving a day early I managed to obtain their normal rate and treat myself to one night of luxury before moving to my apartment.

I'm not so sure it will be easy to recreate this show virtually using Zoom or Skype, the unintended meetings at the coffee area or at the bar in the evening just won't be possible, and it will just be another video conference like the recent 121 and Mines and Money shows I think.

Let's hope the vaccines are available soon and we can all go

back to conferencing as it should be, with personal meetings and engagement, there simply isn't a better way to build trust.
